

## Become A CHASS F1RST EDUCATOR 2019-2020

## **Apply Today!**

**CHASS F1RST** is a program for first-year students entering into the College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences. The program invites students to participate in unique learning communities designed to ensure that participants succeed and excel in the first year at the University of California, Riverside. Students in the program enroll in a year-long course sequence (CHASS Connect, PRBS PATH, and Exploratory Scholars) or a quarter-long sequence (Fall Transitions) and enjoy the benefits of significant interaction with program faculty and graduate teaching assistants, personalized advisement, and peer facilitated workshops.

Peer Educator responsibilities include:

- Develop lesson plans in collaboration with faculty and the CHASS F1RST staff and facilitate small group discussions on a weekly basis, being prompt and well prepared for each session.
- Reach out to and maintain contact with students enrolled in the program via e-mail or phone, and participation in campus social and cultural activities.
- Meet with program participants one-on-one and in small groups to assess student needs; assist students with academic, social and personal concerns; and refer students to appropriate campus resources.
- Attend a mandatory 2-day orientation on September 20 21, 2019

Minimum Qualifications:

- 2.5 cumulative GPA and in good academic standing; maintain an overall 2.5 GPA quarterly.
- Sensitivity to the needs of students from a variety of racial, ethnic, national, political, religious, physical and sexual orientation, and socio-economic backgrounds. Sensitivity to varying levels of academic preparedness.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills and ability to communicate effectively with students.
- Willingness to work collaboratively with undergraduate and graduate students, staff, and faculty partners in the program.
- Good organizational and time management skills.
- Ability to work with and relate to faculty and staff.
- Ability to respond to students in a helping manner. (Teaching or mentoring experience preferred.)
- In order to be eligible to be hired as a Peer Educator, undergraduate students must achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher in CHFY 020: Theory and Practice of Peer Instruction. This course will be offered in Spring 2019. Candidates who successfully pass an interview will be invited to enroll in CHFY 020.
